The Program

The New Center for Psychoanalysis offers a one-year certificate program in psychoanalytic psychotherapy. This program is open to all mental health professionals and other interested persons with appropriate backgrounds.

This program provides a sophisticated educational experience at the cutting edge of current psychodynamic thinking.

Classes meet weekly on Wednesdays from 7 to 10 PM beginning September 2009 and continuing through June 2010 on the campus of the UCI Medical Center in Orange.

Applicants must complete an application form, submit a current CV or resume, and provide two letters of recommendation. One or more personal interviews with a member of the faculty will be required. You may request an application form by telephone (310-478.6541x10) or e-mail (lisar@n-p-c.org).

Because of limited class size, early application is recommended.

Continuing Education Units

The New Center for Psychoanalysis awards a certificate of achievement upon completion of the program and provides continuing education units for physicians, psychologists, social workers, and MFTs. This certificate neither constitutes a license nor implies completion of psychoanalytic training.

Fees

Tuition fees total \$1,200 for the year. In addition, there is a \$200 materials fee. The application fee is \$40. Course participants will be required to purchase two assigned text books.

Through our affiliation with UCI, medical students, residents, and fellows may attend the course as an elective within their programs without charge.
