FIRST YEAR

- Infancy: The Psychological Impact of the Relationship Between Infant and Caregiver
- An Overview of the Techniques of Child Therapy
- Application of the Basic Psychoanalytic Principles: the Setting, Therapeutic Alliance, Theory and Technique of Play, Countertransference Implications
- Failures in Attachment; Childhood Trauma
- Psychosexual Development from 3 to 6 Years
- Latency and Socialization
- Effects of Technoculture and Children's Literature

SECOND YEAR

- Psychoanalytic Theory of Development from Puberty through Adolescence and Emerging Adulthood
- OCD, Body Dysmorphic Disorder, Eating Disorders, Self-Mutilation, Substance Abuse
- Developmental Psychopathology: Anxiety, Depression, Development Delays, Oppositional and Aggressive Behavior, Impulse Disorders, ADHD
- Identity Formation, Gender Identity
- Neurobiology of Autistic Spectrum Disorders and Treating Asperger's Disorder
- Working with Parents (psychoanalytic technique of working with a wide range of parental figures, such as LGBT, adoptive, divorced, immigrant, and single parents)

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Candidates must be licensed in the mental health field: MDs, psychologists, LMFTs, social workers, and registered nurses
- Application Deadline: September 10
- A personal interview is required
- The review process takes 2-4 weeks

FEES

- Application Fee: \$50 (Waived before June 15)
- Tuition: \$2,100 per year
- Yearly Administration Fee: \$100
- Scholarship applications are available
