About the Program

Three Possible Pathways

One may complete the program in one of three ways: a) after completion of the adult program, b) combined with the adult program, or c) as the child and adolescent program only.

Three Program Components

Like the Adult Psychoanalytic Training Program, the Child and Adolescent Psychoanalytic Training Program is built on the three classic psychoanalytic pillars: personal analysis, didactic courses, and supervised clinical cases with children and adolescents 0-21+.

Three Supervised Training Cases

Child Clinical Associates will treat three training cases of patients ranging from 0-21+ and their parents and families. They can choose supervisors from expert Child Supervising Analysts at NCP or through the American Psychoanalytic Association.

Infant, Child & Adolescent Clinic

Unique to NCP is the establishment of a low-fee Infant, Child and Adolescent Clinic. Child Clinical Associates in the Training Program are matched to work with local families. NCP has established and raises designated funds to support the operation of the 0-21+ Clinic.
