NCP's Child and Adolescent Psychoanalytic Training Program (CAPT) is designed to train clinicians who work with children and adolescents by expanding their theoretical framework and clinical expertise. A deeper understanding of child development can also augment clinical work with adults. The didactic curriculum of study integrates classical, contemporary, and evolving approaches to theory and technique. The courses include a monthly child study group and bimonthly continuous case conferences along with psychoanalytic work with young children and adolescents.

Unique to NCP, there is a low-fee infant, child and adolescent clinic. Parents/legal guardians contact the clinic director first to learn about the clinic and then are assigned to Child Clinical Associates who are in their geographic region for an evaluation and possible treatment.
